
IN Q Glass Dackly SHERIDAN LE FANU

Jonathan Keeble combines his audio work with a busy theatre and TV career. He has featured in over 500 radio plays for the BBC, from Shakespeare to Sherlock Holmes. He also played the evil Owen in *The Archers*. Much in demand for his voice work, this ranges from the audio guide for the Sistine Chapel to voicing the Angel of Death in the film *Hellboy 2*. An award-winning reader, Jonathan has recorded over 100 audiobooks.



Daniel Philpott trained at LAMDA and, after success in the prestigious Carleton Hobbs Award for Radio Drama, has been prolific in BBC Radio and the Spoken Word industry. His theatre work includes numerous productions on the London fringe. For Naxos AudioBooks he has recorded A Life of Shakespeare, Famous People in History – Volume 2, Dracula, Frankenstein, Pygmalion and Our Island Story.



Sean Barrett started acting as a boy on BBC children's television in the days before colour, when it went out live. He grew up through Z Cars, Armchair Theatre, Minder and Father Ted. His theatre credits include Peter Pan at the old Scala Theatre and Noël Coward's Suite in 3 Keys in the West End. Films include War & Peace, Dunkirk and A Cry from the Streets. He was a member of the BBC Radio Drama Company. He also features in Molloy, Malone Dies, The Unnamable, The Voice of the Buddha and Canterbury Tales III and read the part of Vladimir in Waiting for Godot and Nakata in Kafka on the Shore for Naxos AudioBooks.



David Horovitch has had a long and distinguished career. His appearances in the theatre include many in the West End, the National Theatre and the RSC. On television he is best known for his performance as Inspector Slack in *Miss Marple*. Among his many readings for Naxos AudioBooks are Lampedusa's *The Leopard*, Dickens's *Nicholas Nickleby*, Ovid's *Metamorphoses* and Conrad's *Heart of Darkness*.



Nicholas Boulton studied at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, winning the BBC Carleton Hobbs Award for Radio in 1993. Since then he has been heard in numerous productions for BBC Radio 4 and the World Service. Work for Naxos AudioBooks includes Cecil in Lady Windermere's Fan and most recently David Copperfield and Ancient Egypt – The Glory of the Pharaohs. Film work includes Shakespeare in Love and Topsy Turvy. Theatre credits include Platonov for the Almeida, Henry V for the RSC and Arcadia for the Theatre Royal Haymarket.



Alison Pettitt studied Biochemistry at University College London, and, after a spell of TIE (Theatre in Education), turned her attention towards acting. She has performed with the Radio Drama Company and has worked extensively in theatre and television. Her theatre performances include *The Glass Slipper* (Southwark), *As You Like It* (Creation Theatre), *The Nutcracker* at (West Yorkshire Playhouse) and *Taking Steps* (Windsor and Sonning). Television includes *Threesome* for Big Talk Productions, *Poems from Other Cultures* for the BBC and *AS Guru* for BBC Education. Radio includes *Birdsong, The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy, Smiley's People, I Claudius, Trilby* and *The Archers*.
